

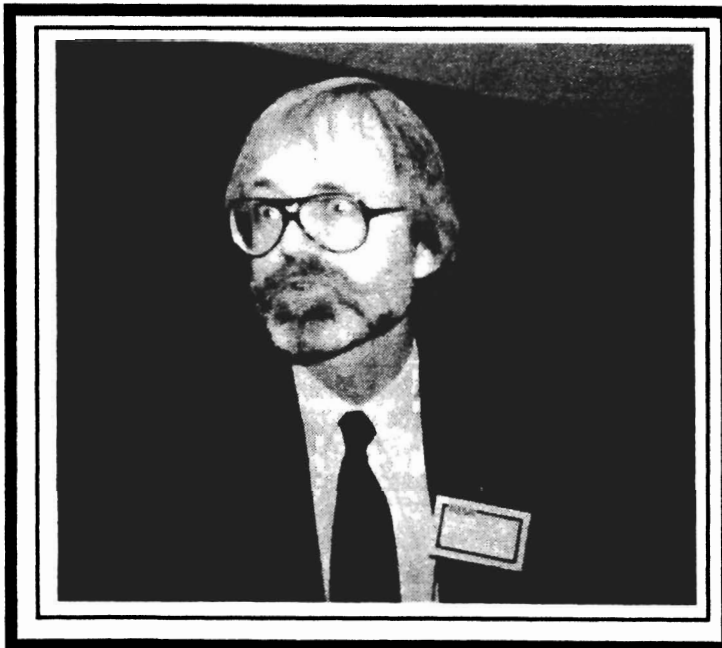
DEDICATION
