

## Estimated Number of Standard Celeration Charts as of 2000

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When writing an article in 1998, I wanted to make the following statement. "What's so critical about one minute? I don't know but I do know that over 1.2 million Standard Celeration Charts...tell us that behavior changes rapidly and securely with a one minute timing" (Calkin, 2000). Since I did not know the number, I asked on the Standard Celeration List Serve for people to send an estimate of the number of projects they had supervised and done to date. I also contacted people not on the list serve who had generated large numbers of charts over the years. These charts included the Timings, Daily, Weekly (Weekly Behavior Chart and Weekly Summary Chart), Monthly (Monthly Behavior Chart and Monthly Summary Chart), and Yearly Charts.

Making the assumption that people who count as well as teach and supervise counting as a vocation, would give fairly accurate estimates, I trust these estimated data. Some information came as "I supervised x schools of x students each. Each student had three charts per semester, so that equals \_\_\_." Other people sent me a total number. At least one person counted the charts.

Table 1 gives the information as of mid-February 2000 with one addition. I presented this information at the Standard Celeration Chart Share at the Association for Behavior Analysis Convention in Washington D.C. in May 2000. At that time, Melrose gave me the number of charts she had done and supervised. I added that to this list also.
